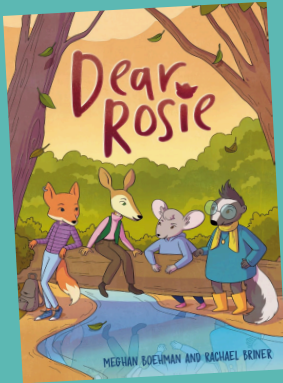

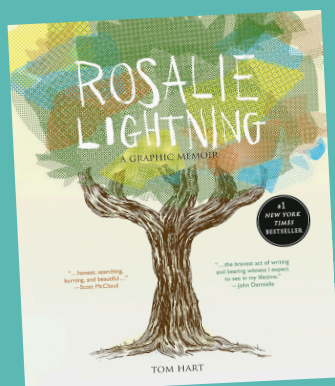
Dear Rosie by Meghan Boehman and Rachel Briner
