Childhood bereavement on the Cape & Islands

In honor of National Children's Grief Awareness Month, we have relevant data pertaining to childhood bereavement on the Cape & Islands. The Childhood Bereavement Estimation Model (CBEM), which was developed by Judi's House/JAG Institute in partnership with the New York Life Foundation, approximates rates of U.S. children and youth who will experience the death of a parent or sibling. Sharing Kindness recently requested bereavement rates from Judi's House/JAG for our local counties.

Key takeaways:

- ♥ In Massachusetts, 1 in 13 children will experience the death of a sibling or parent by age 18. In Barnstable County, that number is 1 in 9 (for children on Dukes and Nantucket Counties, the estimation is 1 in 15 and 1 in 24, respectfully).
- ♥ 10% of children in Barnstable County, 5% of children in Dukes County, and 4% of children in Nantucket County will specifically experience the death of a parent.
- From 2018-21, the leading cause of death for 30-49-year-olds (estimated age range of parents of children under 18) in Barnstable County was accidents. The majority of those deaths are attributable to accidental drug overdose.

...and why it matters:

Bereaved children are more likely to die from suicide, more likely to experience substance abuse, and less likely to complete high school or enter higher education.

...But providing a safe space for children to share their feelings, talk about their grief and receive support from others who understand loss can help reduce risk.

These are the benefits of peer grief support, the model used in our free clinician-led programs. There is an immediate need for these services on the local level, and it is our goal to offer hope and support for bereaved children and families in our community.

Jeff's Place truly feels like a home. It is warm, welcoming, and filled with color, from the mosaic "Hope grows here" mural that greeted us upon entering, to the brightly colored "In loving memory of" donation plaques on the wall of each room.

A small yard and a basketball hoop provide space for kids to play before group, and on special occasions, a stone walkway is lined with luminaries in memory of those who have died.

A glimmer of hope

- ★ Falmouth High School's Hope Squad (the FIRST local school to join the effort) recently presented at the Safe Schools conference in New Hampshire.
- ★ Nauset and Monomoy Regional High Schools, Cape Cod Tech, and Barnstable High School now have trained advisors and are in the process of building their Hope Squads.
- ★ Bourne High School, St. John Paul II School, and Falmouth Middle School the three newest schools to get involved are scheduling their advisor training dates soon.
